Sound Transit Tacoma Link Extension

 The Links to Opportunity Project was initiated in 2016 to actively engage the community in designing streetscape improvements along Sound Transit's Tacoma Link Extension route. The scope of these improvements includes sidewalks, lighting, street furniture, wayfinding signage, trees, and landscaping. The resulting streetscape design will enable safe access for all users including pedestrians, cyclists, motorists, and transit riders of all ages and abilities. Pierce Transit Bus Rapid Transit

 Pierce Transit, working in partnership with the City of Tacoma, Pierce County, Washington State Department of Transportation, Sound Transit, Puget Sound Regional Council, and other agencies, is conducting a high capacity transit (HCT) study of a 14-mile corridor along Pacific Avenue | SR 7 between downtown Tacoma and Spanaway. Sound Transit Tacoma Dome Link Extension

 Sound Transit will hold public meetings in mid-2018 to collect input regarding the ST3 representative project and potential alternatives and will then analyze the benefits and impacts of the alternatives selected.
