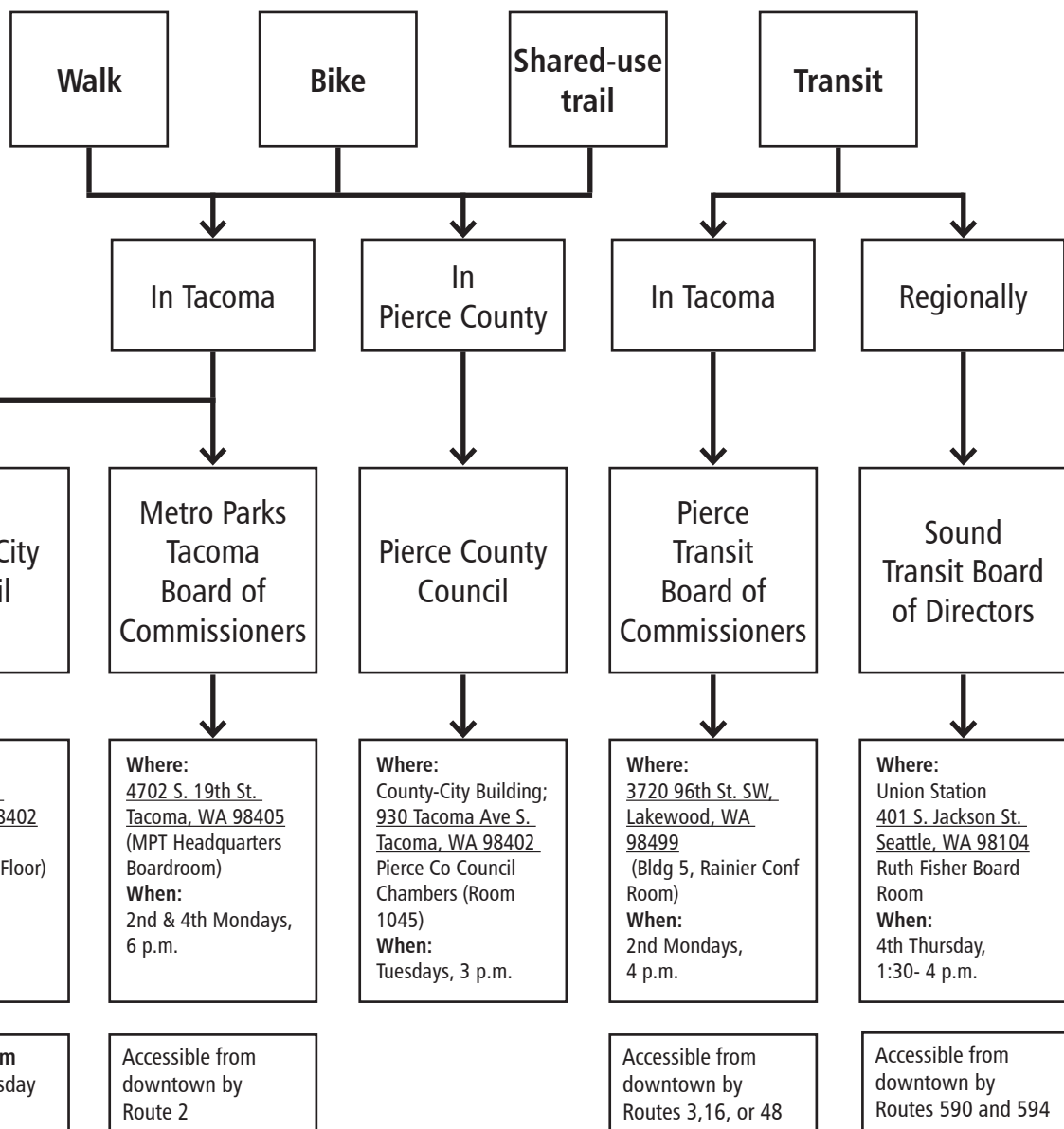


# How to Speak up for Walking, Biking, and Transit

Do you have a specific issue with a street safety like a pothole or out street lights? Use the City of Tacoma's 311 app or website

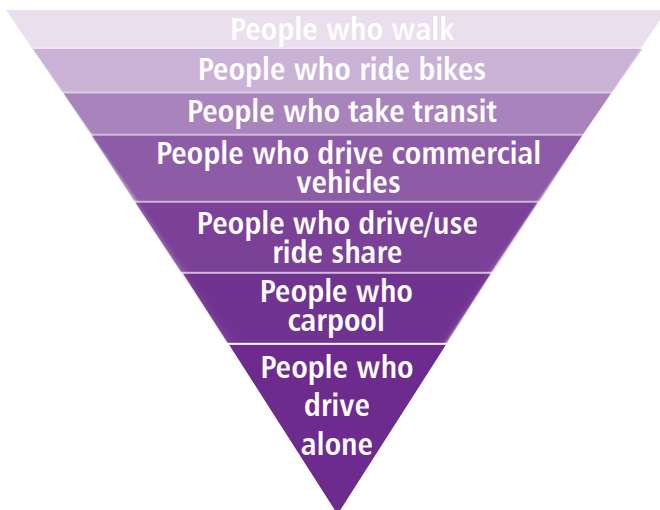


Find out who represents you and their contact information using the Pierce County Civic App or Website

### When Writing a Letter to OR Speaking before Council/Commissioners:

1. Establish credibility: I live/work here and I take the bus/ride my bike/walk
2. Show gratitude: Thank you for your time/for implementing /adopting measures/supporting \_\_\_\_
3. Share your concern(s): I would like you to continue to support \_\_\_\_/collaborate with \_\_\_\_/consider \_\_\_\_

### Get involved in your Tacoma Neighborhood Council:

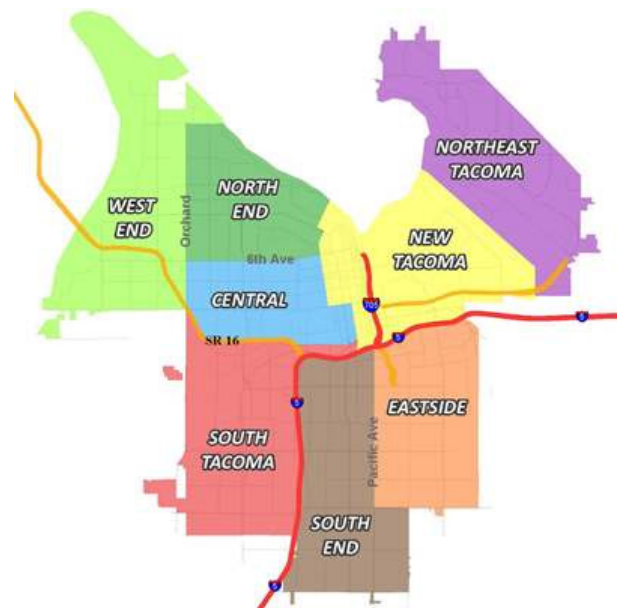
Each Neighborhood Council serves as an independent, non-profit organization to promote community-based efforts for neighborhood improvement.
